Let me introduce you to my Year 7 classes at Hornsby Girls' High School, in numbers. 105 is the number of Year 7 students currently enrolled in SRE. **19** call themselves Christian. 18 students did not SRE attend in primary school. 60% describe themselves as non-Christian. 25 students belong to another religion, like Hinduism, Buddhism, Islam, and Sikhism. 25% do not believe in the

God described in the Bible. 17 students think Jesus probably never existed.

I cannot think of many other opportunities in our society like this – where young people who do not yet trust Jesus as Lord, voluntarily come to explore the basics of the Christian faith from the Bible and to discuss purpose, values and worldviews. It is a blessing that public high schools continue to provide timetabled lessons within the busyness of a school day to allow for this! I am feeling excited but also overwhelmed by having such a range of students with

different beliefs and exposure to religion. This term, we will be looking at an introduction to the Bible and I am hoping we will have good discussion around why people read sacred texts. I am looking forward to what God is going to do and believe 100% that He has graciously placed each student in SRE for a reason. Please pray for me for wisdom in preparing lessons that find common ground. Pray also that lessons help students of other faiths to feel valued, and able to contribute in meaningful ways.

A Surprising Question!

"What really happens when people sell their soul to the Devil?"



This was a surprising question I received in a Year 9 class recently, at **Normanhurst Boys' High School**. It highlights the genuine curiosity that students have about how we should understand the reality of a spiritual world. would this mean for the rest of the spiritual world? What would this do to our understanding of God?

We were able to have a good discussion in class about the fact that the spiritual realm is real, since God is real. Perhaps the most important thing to remember however, is that whilst the Devil is real, we need not fear him, as sin, death, and the Devil have been defeated by Jesus on the cross.
