Who is Jesus Really?



The Christmas account in the Bible, is a wonderful way to engage Year 7 students at the end of the year. As the general excitement of school finishing mixes with the anticipation of Christmas Day, I take the boys back to the very first Christmas. What did the first Christmas really look like?

I show them this painting of the nativity scene, and ask them what they think might be wrong with it? We strip back all the artistic license used to compress the various parts of the story into one image, removing the angels, the wise men, the halos, and the unnaturally interested looking animals, leaving us with a scene that appears a lot less like a fairytale!

What this picture does not include however, are the shepherds to whom the angels did appear, announcing that they would find a baby, not with a glow around his head, but simply wrapped in cloth, lying in a feeding trough. **Importantly, the shepherds are told that this ordinary looking baby would be the promised Messiah, God's promised King, and Saviour.** Luke tells us in 2:17 that, "When they had seen him, they spread the word concerning what had



been told them about this child." The nativity scene is not one of religious fantasy, but the real, simple, and humble entry of God, into the needy world of humankind.

Please pray that the students at NBHS would recognise Jesus, not as religious fantasy, but as the Saviour, King, and Lord of all.

Significant Links in the Chain of Faith!

A person's faith journey can be described as a chain, with each link representing something or someone that moves them along in their faith. This could be a conversation, a period of wrestling with an emotion, an experience, or the discovery of new information.

SRE is one of the links, and I believe it is a significant one. At the start of 2025, SRE will be a link for 69% of Year 7, 65% of Year 8, 50% of Year 9 and 27% of Year 10 students. In Term 1, students will explore what makes the Bible special, the rescue story of Exodus, Jesus' encounters with different people, and the role of faith in everyday life.

Another link is the 'Clubs Expo,' where our Christian lunchtime group, 'Highlite,' handed out gospel tracts, and shared with staff and students what happens at the lunchtime meetings, boldly identifying themselves as Christians. A personal highlight was when two sisters took Bibles from the stand – even if it was motivated by FOMO! (*Fear of missing out.*)

Attending the 'Meet the Teacher Year 7 Night' was the most recent link, creating the opportunity for me to introduce myself to parents and promote



SRE. I have been encouraged, by the goodness of God in the many ways, He pursues students.
