Differing Responses



It's interesting how different students respond to the same lesson. In Years 7 and 8, we've been exploring the life of Moses and the events surrounding the Exodus, including the giving of the Ten Commandments. The content was new for most students and in our final lesson, they had the opportunity to ask questions in small groups. And they didn't hold back! Why did God wait so long before freeing the Israelites from slavery? Why the prolonged process of plagues when God could just eliminate Pharaoh? Was it moral for all the

Egyptians to suffer? Where did the blood from the Nile River come from? How can Christians believe such crazy stories in the Bible? What about scientific evidence? How does God communicate today? Does he judge us by sending suffering? Why is there a commandment to not murder when God sends judges to kill others? Why aren't there commandments on caring for the environment? Isn't God being oppressive when he requires Israel to faithfully obey him?

I'm sure some of my answers left students more confused than they began with at the start of the lesson but I love that God allows us to ask hard questions and that the process of searching for answers can strengthen our faith. I was particularly encouraged by a conversation after class with a Year 8 student (scan the QR code to learn more). The seed



has been sown and I draw encouragement in knowing that God is the one who will bring growth and spiritual understanding (1 Corinthians 3:6-7).

The Bible – One Single Story!



One of my great joys in teaching SRE is in helping my students understand how **the whole Bible** is a single story, that **points to Jesus as our Saviour**. In Terms 2 and 3, Year 8 looked at the story of the Old Testament, beginning with Creation and The Fall. When Satan speaks to the woman, we see a pattern of sin established, she SEES the fruit, DESIRES it for what it offers, and so TAKES it for herself. This See-Desire-Take pattern then becomes a test for others. The boys in Year 8 began to recognise the pattern. Beginning with

Abraham and Sarah, who seeing that they have no child, and desiring to fulfil God's promise, take Hagar to use for themselves. Then in others such as David, who sees Bathsheba and desires her, so takes her for himself, or Jonah, who sees that God is offering forgiveness to the Ninevites, but desires their destruction, so takes himself away from Nineveh, albeit unsuccessfully. Finally we reach Jesus, who is shown by Satan things desirable for him. Yet Jesus refuses to take these things for himself, trusting instead in the goodness of God and his word, therefore passing the test and going on to fulfil the promise of a perfect saviour, who crushes the head of the serpent. Thank God for Jesus who passes this test on our behalf, and that the boys in Year 8 can see how this is who the whole story of the Bible points towards. **Pray that God will give them understanding, and they will put their trust in Jesus as their Lord and Saviour, as a result.**
