### The 7 Signs in John's Gospel.

In Term 4, Year 10 students at Normanhurst Boys' High School, will be looking at the 7 signs of Jesus in John's gospel. The lessons are not so much about giving the boys the answer to the question "Who is Jesus?", as we began with in Year 7, but bringing things back full circle after 4 years of classes, so that they can better piece together for themselves, what John reveals in his gospel. We look at how John does

not write in isolation, but draws on themes and ideas from all of Scripture, impregnating his stories of the miracles of Jesus with deeper meaning than a surface reading of the text might suggest. Even his choice of just seven signs is an indicator that John thinks these signs are sufficient for providing us with a



picture of what we need to know

about who Jesus is. As this unit is the final set of lessons that the boys will

receive, it is my last chance to impress upon them the beauty and the power of Scripture, and so challenge them not to forget the things they have learnt in SRE lessons, but to pursue truth in life through continuing to always engage with God's Word. It is my prayer that these boys will go on to keep reading the Bible, growing in their understanding of God, being challenged to live lives to his glory. May this be your prayer for the Year 10

#### **Exploring Faith Beyond the Classroom**



It is that time of year when graduation activities and celebrations are in full swing, alongside conversations with Year 12 students about life beyond school. These moments have prompted me to reflect on one of the purposes of SRE, which is to equip students to explore faith beyond the classroom, and for Christianity to remain openly attractive.

This sentiment was present in Year 10's final lesson which is of 'church' We can be encouraged that students generally

focused on the topic of 'church.' We can be encouraged that students generally had positive associations with church and could describe some of the key aspects of our gatherings. They were aware of the number of churches around school, which prompted questions like: "Why are there so many?" "What's the difference between denominations?" "How do I know if I'm going to the right one?" and "Why is my church seen as a cult?"

Using the Corinthian church as a case study, we explored how church is a community of sinners who are learning to follow Jesus together. Each person is valued and needed as God brings together natural enemies to form a family.

An unexpected highlight was their interest in exploring NCEA church websites, as well as those of their friends' churches. For some, this reignited curiosity about church after years of absence - whether due to COVID lockdowns or busyness. As we partner in sharing Jesus with students, may God direct many of them into your communities, where they can continue their faith journey, and get a taste of how good life in God's kingdom can be.
